#### **Butterleigh Overseers accounts**

These volumes are held at the Devon Record Office(DRO)<sup>1</sup>. They cover the periods 1711 to 1770 and 1797 to 1819. They combine income (rate payments) and expenditure. Accounts run Easter to Easter, so the accounts year varies in length. Payments were recorded four-weekly.

From the time of Elizabeth 1<sup>st</sup> the Poor Law in England used the parish as the primary unit for helping the poor. The system started at the end of the 16<sup>th</sup> Century and continued with modifications until the mid 1830s. when responsibility was transferred to Unions, and Butterleigh became part of Tiverton Union.

#### Income

Nearly all income came from the Poor Rate, a tax levied on the farms according to their values and paid by the tenant or owner. Some money was obtained from fathers of illegitimate children toward the cost of raising them and small amounts were raised through disposal of pauper possessions.

#### **Expenditure**

Expenditure covered payments during periods of sickness and unemployment, for clothing and other necessities and also burials. They were divided into

<u>Regular payments</u> which are the first items to be listed. They were often paid to a person for a considerable period. Textbooks and papers often refer to these as pensions, although they were not only paid to the elderly.

"Extraordinary" payments a blanket term which covered all other payments. In addition to the items mentioned above, there are entries for legal costs relating to settlement. A bona fide traveller (one with a pass) would be given a small amount of money to cover him/her to the next parish. The account paid some of the costs of the village band, and also the County rates.

<u>Burials</u>: Where the parish paid for a burial an Affidavit is often mentioned. This is the result of the Burying in Woollen Acts which were in force from 1666 to 1814, but were generally ignored after 1770. The acts required that burials should only be in woollen shrouds and an affidavit to that effect had to be sworn in front of a JP.

<u>Apprentices</u>: Children maintained by the parish would be bound apprentice – usually to a farmer in the parish. This gives rise to entries for indentures, clothing costs and binding fees; these last paid to the master.

#### Appointments

Overseers were appointed by the vestry - a body which consisted of the ratepayers of the parish - in practice the tenant farmers, occasionally joined by owners of estates in the parish. An Easter meeting would sign off the accounts and appoint the overseers, churchwarden and other officials for the coming year.

<u>The accounts</u> were photographed at the DRO using a Nikon Coolpix P520 camera on a stand. They were cropped using Jasc Paint Shop Pro 9. This program was also used to improve readability, mostly by increasing image contrast.

The transcription is as accurate as I can make it, consistent with readability.
