Transcribed from the 21 May 1822 edition of The Strabane Morning Post:

On Sunday morning last, a cavalcade of above 140 men, women, and children, passed through Sheffield and on the Glossop road, on their way by Liverpool to settle in the United States of America. These families consisted of poor Agriculturists from the neighbourhood of Louth and Market Rasen, in Lincolnshire; they arrived in Sheffield on Saturday night, in waggons loaded with beds, clothing, and provisions, for their intended voyage.
