

This is the last Will and Testament of me Jane Neale of Mansfield Woodhouse in the County of Nottingham Widow made this twenty seventh day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy three in manner following first I will that all my just Debts and funeral Expences be paid and discharged by my Executor herein after named Also I give and bequeath to my God Sons James Green and Pendock Neale and my Daughter Martha the Wife of the Reverend George Butt five Guineas each to buy each of them a ..... And Whereas I some time since gave my Promissory Note to George Thompson Esquire, one of the Executors of my late Husband John Neale Esquire to Pay the sum of sixty Pounds to my Sons in Law the Reverend John Neale and Thomas Neale equally to be divided betwixt them Therefore I will and devise that my Executor pay the said sum of sixty Pounds to my said Sons in Law the Reverend John Neale and Thomas Neale and take in my said Note so given to the said George Thompson for that purpose Also I give devise and bequeath All the Rest Residue and Remainder both of my Real and Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever or wheresoever unto George Aldrich of Edwinstone in the said County of Nottingham Doctor in Physic his Heirs Executors Administrators and Assigns for ever And lastly I hereby Constitute and Appoint the said George Aldrich hereby revoking and making void all former Wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I the said Jane Neale the Testatrix have to this my last Will and Testament set my Hand and Seal the day and year above written \_ Jane Neale
